Prevent Discounted In-State Tuition For Illegal Aliens: This amendment would have deleted a provision from SF1989 that provided discounted in-state college tuition rates for illegal aliens (see 2007-2008 House Journal page 4039).	YES	YES
Freedom to Buy Out-of-State Health Plans: An amendment to HF3391 that would have allowed Minnesotans to purchase health care plans governed by the laws of another state, from which the plan was purchased, thereby allowing increased options and affordability (see 2007-2008 House Journal page 10048). Eliminate State Income Tax on Social Security: An amendment to HF3149 that would eliminate state income tax of Social Security income (see 2007-2008 House Journal page 11320).	NO	YES
Give Married Couples Priority in Adoption Placement: An amendment to SF2171 to provide married couples priority over unmarried persons in adoption placements (see 2007-2008 House Journal Page 4313).	NO	YES
Require Parental Consent for Testing of Students Personal Beliefs: A vote to require parental consent before children are given school surveys pertaining to their personal behavior, family life, religious, political and sexual practices. (See 2007-2008 House Journal page.3979).	NO	YES
Require Parental Notice Before Dispensing Oral Contraceptives to Minors: A vote to require family planning agencies to notify parents before dispensing oral contraceptives to minor children (see 2007-2008 House Journal page 4308).	NO	YES
Eliminate Comprehensive Sex-Ed Mandates: An amendment to HF6 to delete the proposed state mandate that all schools teach contraception to students aged 12-17. The curriculum mandated by this section promotes risky sexual activities and alternative lifestyles (see 2007-2008 House Journal page 3985).	NO	YES
Arts & Outdoors Sales Tax Increase: A historic \$11 billion sales tax increase to fund arts and outdoor programs to be approved by voters through a constitutional amendment (see 2007-2008 House Journal page 7684).	YES	NO
Massive Transportation Tax Increase: HF2800 created one of the single largest tax increases in Minnesota's history, raising the tax rate on gasoline and motor vehicles statewide. It also authorized a 1/2 percent sales tax increase in metro counties for mass transit programs (see 2007-2008 House Journal page 7883).	YES	NO
Tax Increase on Compressed Natural Gas: Bill number SF3564 implements a 37% increase in the tax on compressed natural gas for transportation. Increases the tax collected on natural gas from \$1.19 to \$1.91 per thousand cubic feet (see 2007-2008 House Journal page 10737).	YES	NO
Warehousing Newborns' DNA Without Parental Consent: Bill number SF 3138 removes the requirement for explicit parental consent for health officials to collect and store samples of newborns' DNA (see 2007-2008 House Journal page 12224).	YES	NO
